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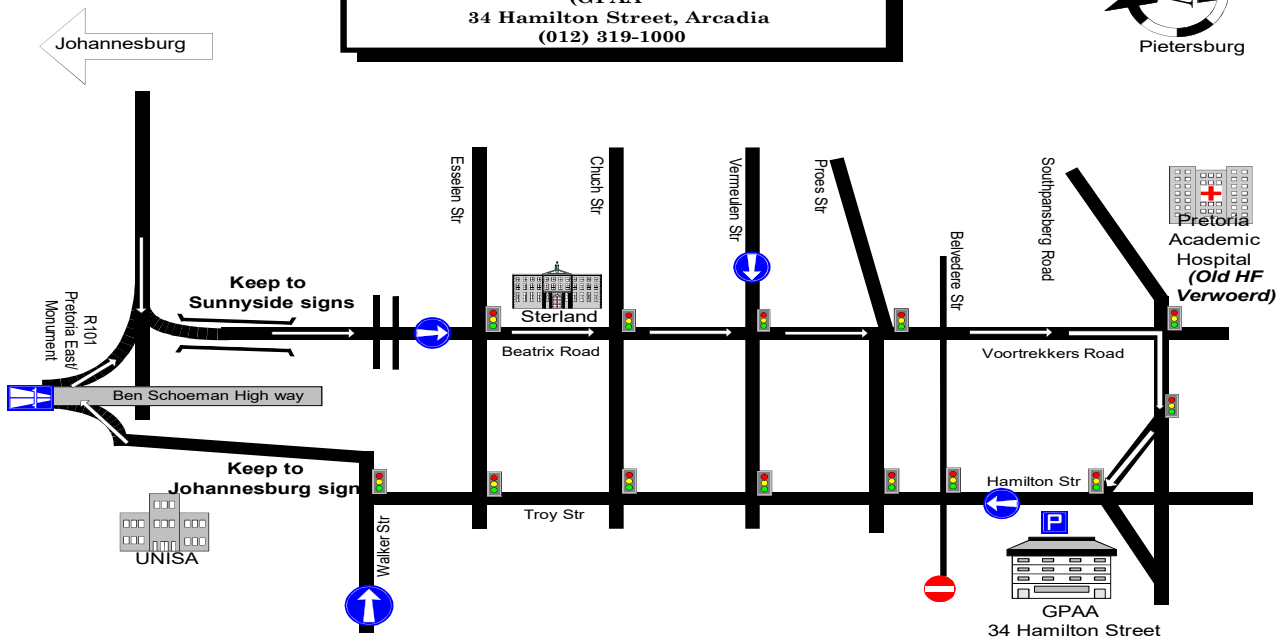

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## TERMS OF REFERENCE

### 1. OBJECTIVE

The GPAA intends to appoint a panel of service providers to assist/ supplement GPAA internal investigation capacity to investigate and report on alleged and actual incidences of :

- fraud and corruption to protect the fund from any actual or potential loss.
- disputed member's beneficiaries and marriages

### 2. FUNCTIONS OF THE GPAA

- 2.1 The Government Pensions Administration Agency (GPAA) is a government component which reports to the Minister of Finance and administers funds and schemes on behalf of the Government Employees Pension Fund (GEPF), the largest pension fund in Africa, and National Treasury. It administers the pension affairs of approximately 1, 85 million government employees and those of pensioners, spouses and dependants.
- 2.2 Similarly , the purpose of the Forensic and Fraud Prevention Management Unit is to investigate all reported potential and corruption incidents in the GPAA and to manage the prevention of fraud and corruption through education and awareness and to make recommendations on the remedial actions.

### 3. METHODOLOGY

The following elements are critical to the successful delivery of the project. The service provider must,

- 3.1 be able to deliver on their obligation in respect of investigation services required by the Unit as per the scope that will be determined;
- 3.2 have the necessary capacity, skill and experience to perform quality work (Partner / Engagement Director should at least have an NQF 7 level qualification. Preference will be given to team members, including the Partner / Engagement Director who are certified Fraud Examiners by the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners (ACFE) and, or certified as Commercial Forensic Practitioners (ICFP);
- 3.3 Forensic investigation capacity, skills and expertise of the bidder for the requirements of the bid (Details of the investigation team that will be involved in the assignment, including number and level / ranks of team members to be involved in the assignment, as well as the curriculum vitae for each team member);
- 3.4 have a quick turn-around time in terms of project completion as per the Project Plan approved by the GPAA, and is able to respond to the GPAA's requests at short notice;
- 3.5 The successful bidders to be placed on the panel / database shall ensure that the team presented to the GPAA is in line with the proposal submitted, and team members who exit the employment of the

successful bidder, are substituted with team members with similar experience and qualifications or above;

- 3.6 Project Manager / Engagement director exiting the project should serve at least a period of 30 days to ensure continuity, parallel to the next lead that will be appointed. Junior investigation resources, who will be part of the team, must possess appropriate skills, experience and qualifications;
- 3.7 Demonstrate knowledge of the forensic investigation, and an understanding of Public Service Regulatory Framework such as, but not limited to: the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA) and its regulations; Treasury Regulation, Public Services Procurement Policies, South African Constitution, Minimum Information Security Standards (MISS), Labour Legislation, Criminal Procedures Act, Promotion of Access to Information Act, Public Service Anti-Corruption Strategy; Code of Conduct for the Public Service, Protected Disclosure Amendment Act (PDA) and Protection of Personal Information Act (POPI) .

#### 4. SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of this project will include amongst others the following;

- (a) Conduct preliminary interviews with GPAA staff members to understand the GPAA systems and processes.
- (b) To interview members/pensioner beneficiaries affected with the possible alleged fraudulent transactions.
- (c) Utilize the latest available technology or specialized system to image relevant computers, interrogate GPAA systems, download and analyse the relevant electronic data.
- (d) Establish who is responsible for the alleged fraud or the unauthorized transfer of funds and identify all relevant activities and or individuals involved.
- (e) Establish who received the funds that were transferred from the GPAA. This part of the investigation may have to be conducted in conjunction with relevant law enforcement agency, should GPAA decide to go this route.
- (f) Prepare a flow of funds / audit trail if investigation suggest otherwise, relating to the funds irregularly transferred.
- (g) Quantify any possible/actual losses and recommend actions against parties responsible for the irregularities and;
- (h) Supply any further assistance as may be required and directed by the GPAA i.e. participation in disciplinary hearings and communication with law enforcement agencies.
- (i) To assist with the investigation emanating from an on-going transactional data analytics with suspicions of fraud.
- (k) Issue formal investigation reports on completion of each case

The key deliverables and the functions to be performed by the service providers who are appointed on the database / panel and allocated cases as per the quotation process for the Forensic Investigations will, inter alia, include the following:

- (l) Conduct preliminary investigation into identified transactions / cases and determine investigation strategy or advice for reporting to the (GPAA);

- (m) Develop an investigation plan to be reviewed and approved by the GPAA;
- (n) Investigation assignments are to be performed using the appointed firm's investigation approach / methodology which should be in line with the Public Service Code of Conduct; the Professional Standards set by the Association of Fraud Examiners / Institute of Commercial Forensic Practitioners and other related Legislation, Regulations and best practice applicable to forensic / fraud investigations. The above includes investigation reports. (Cases as per Allegations Registers include amongst others; irregular awarding of tenders, conflict of interest, misuse of vehicles, fronting, cover quoting, financial misconduct, abuse and misuse of state assets and resources procurement fraud, fraud through misrepresentation, etc.
- (o) The investigation scope should, amongst others cover the following:-
- Determine whether irregularities occurred with regard to the allegations reported,
  - Determine and identify officials of the GPAA and / or other parties involved in irregularities that occurred,
  - Recommend appropriate action to be instituted by the GPAA where irregularities have been confirmed.
- (p) Write and present comprehensive reports to Management and the Audit Committee through the office of the GPAA,
- (q) All investigation reports must be accompanied by an evidence file and must be made available within three working days after completion of the investigation assignment to the GPAA.
- (r) The evidence file must be made available to the GPAA and will remain the property of the GPAA. The evidence will be for supporting Investigation Report findings and shall also be made available to the Audit Committee and the Auditor-General of South Africa on request.
- (s) A declaration of Conflict of Interest is required (Independence and Objectivity of the investigation team) – in carrying out the work, the successful bidder must ensure that its staff maintains individual by remaining independent of the activities they perform. The service provider shall therefore:-
- Have no executive or managerial powers, functions or duties except those relating to the project,
  - Not be involved in the day-to-day operations of the GPAA,
  - Declare any conflict of interest on each investigation assignment; and make formal written disclosures to the management should they have potential impairments to independence or objectivity relating to their responsibilities.
- (t) Assist in the development of charge sheets where disciplinary actions have been recommended and, lead evidence during the process;
- (u) Lead evidence in court if required;
- (v) Attend planned meetings with the relevant GPAA managers and relevant managers in the GPAA during the duration of the contract and subsequent to the period where relevant i.e. leading evidence in the disciplinary processes or court matters as relevant,
- (w) Service providers will be expected to develop and implement strategies for training in order to build capacity and transfer skills to the in-house staff on identified cases where feasible.
- (x) The GPAA will have the discretion to invite service providers based on the work allocation which should not exceed the maximum of three (3) projects within a period of six month (6) months,

- (y) The above objectives are expected to be applied on current cases recorded to be investigated as per the Allegations Register..and as per quotation competitive process that will be applied.

## **5. DURATION OF APPOINTMENT**

This project will be undertaken by a service provider for period of three (3) years subject to annual review and satisfactory performance of key responsibilities.

## **6 GUIDELINE FOR RESPONSE**

The Professional Service Provider should demonstrate the following:

- 6.1 Experience in previous Forensic investigation with minimum of 5 years in the public , private sector and financial sector.
- 6.2 A successful track record of Investigation experience, experience of individual and team members in forensic / fraud investigations and a proposed plan of action to achieve the objectives – the approach/ methodology to be employed. Bidder understands the brief and expectations of the GPAA in terms of its needs.
- 6.3 A detailed explanation of the methodology and approach that will be followed to conduct the Forensic Investigation, capacity and expertise in the form of qualifications and other relevant specialized expertise of the team that will be directly involved – i.e. data analytics, information searches – companies and individuals, etc.
- 6.4 The service provider must be based in South Africa and have/demonstrate the ability and capacity to conduct Forensic Investigations, Level of experience of the investigation team members that will be directly involved with the project: (Number of years of experience of individual team members in forensic/ fraud investigations; Leadership & Supervision, Proficient computer literacy, Exceptional report writing, Presentation skills, Analytical thinking, interviewing skills, ability to access and analyse information and make relevant findings, problem solving skills and ability to influence others, conflict management, forensic investigation, project management, knowledge of case management, legal interpretation skills, level of security).
- 6.5 Skilled and experienced team members to execute the range of activities and tasks specified in the terms of reference with integrity in a professional manner. Demonstration of knowledge and understanding of the Public Service Regulatory Framework such as, but not limited to: the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA) and its Treasury Regulations, Public Services Procurement Policies, South African Constitution, Minimum Information Security Standards (MISS), Labour Legislation, Criminal Procedures Act, Public Service, Protection of Personal Information (POPI) Act.

## **7. PRICE**

Detailed financial proposals will be requested from the highest ranking proposals.

Only the financial proposal of the companies who qualified in terms of the percentage threshold for functionality will be further evaluated.

This bid will follow a three-phase evaluation process, the first phase being an evaluation of *administrative compliance*, followed by the second phase, being *functionality* as per criteria set out in the table above and the third being price and preference points evaluated in terms of the PPR 2017 using the 80/20 criteria.

*N.B.: The minimum qualifying score for functionality in this bid is 65%. suppliers who fail to meet the minimum qualifying score of 65% will be eliminated and not considered for the second phase of evaluation.*

## GENERAL NOTES

The purpose of this Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) document is to:

- a) draw special attention to certain special conditions applicable to Bids, Contracts, Agreements and Orders of the Government Pensions Administration Agency (GPAA); and
- b) to ensure that all bidders are familiar with the special provisions, requirements and conditions that will be applicable in the undertaking of the project and which will form part of the contract documentation and of which due cognisance must be taken in the bidding process.

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminine and neuter.

The General Conditions of Contract (GCC) also forms part of all bidding documents and must be read in conjunction with this Special Conditions of Contract.

Whenever there is a conflict between the GCC and the SCC, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

### 1.1. Bid Submission

1.1.1. Bidders will be permitted to submit bids by hand at:

### 1.2. Validity of Bids

1.2.1. Bidders are required to submit bids valid for **120** days.

### 1.3. Two-stage Bidding

1.3.1. For this bid, a two-stage bidding procedure will be used, under which first un-priced technical proposals on the basis of a conceptual design or performance specifications are invited. The price proposal will only be considered after the technical proposal has been confirmed as being competent and compliant.

1.3.2. A minimum number of **three (3)** copies of the technical proposal are required.

1.3.3. Failure to comply to the above indicated provision will lead to a proposal being disqualified.

## **1.6. Completeness of Documentation**

1.6.1. It will be ascertained whether bids:

- a. Include original tax clearance certificates;
- b. Have been properly signed and completed;
- c. Are substantially responsive to the bidding documents;
- d. Have all the necessary documents attached; and
- e. Are generally in order.

1.6.2. If a bid is not substantially responsive, that is, it contains material deviations from or reservations to the terms, conditions and specifications in the bidding documents, it will not be considered further.

1.6.3. The bidder will not be permitted to correct or withdraw material deviations or reservations once bids have been opened.

## **1.7. Rejection of all Bids**

The GPAA reserves the right to reject all bids if and when deemed necessary. This is justified when there is lack of effective competition, or bids are not substantially responsive.

## **1.8. Associations between Consultants**

1.8.1 Consultants are encouraged to associate with each other to complement their empowerment credentials and their respective areas of expertise, or for other reasons. Joint venture or Consortium means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract.

1.8.2 Consultants who do form a joint venture will agree on their terms and conditions and inform the GPAA of the details of such a joint venture for approval.

## GPAA PROCUREMENT: GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

The purpose of this Annexure is to:

- a) Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to GPAA bids, contracts and orders; and

The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid documents and may not be amended.

Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid should be compiled separately for every bid if applicable and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

## 1. DEFINITIONS

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- 1.1. "**Closing time**" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2. "**Contract**" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3. "**Contract price**" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4. "**Corrupt practice**" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of a public employee in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5. "**Countervailing duties**" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its GPAA and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.6. "**Country of origin**" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7. "**Day**" means calendar day.
- 1.8. "**Delivery**" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9. "**Delivery ex stock**" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
- 1.10. "**Delivery into consignees store or to his site**" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.11. "**Dumping**" occurs when a private enterprise abroad markets its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
- 1.12. "**Force majeure**" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- 1.13. "**Fraudulent practice**" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14. "**GCC**" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15. "**Goods**" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract

- 1.16. **“Imported content”** means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17. **“Local content”** means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18. **“Manufacture”** means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19. **“Order”** means an employee written order issued for the supply of goods for works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20. **“Project site,”** where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21. **“Purchaser”** means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22. **“Republic”** means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23. **“SCC”** means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24. **“Services”** means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- 1.25. **“Written”** or **“in writing”** means handwritten in ink or any form of 96 electronic or mechanical writing.

## **2. APPLICATION**

- 2.1. **These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.**
- 2.2. Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.
- 2.3. Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

## **3. GENERAL**

- 3.1. Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2. With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the State Tender Bulletin. The State Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from [www.employee.gov.za](http://www.employee.gov.za).

## **4. STANDARDS**

- 4.1. The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.



## **5. USE OF CONTRACT DOCUMENTS AND INFORMATION; INSPECTION**

- 5.1. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3. Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4. The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

## **6. PATENT RIGHTS**

- 6.1. The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

## **7. PERFORMANCE**

- 7.1. Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance **security** of the amount specified in SCC.
- 7.2. The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3. The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
  - a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
  - b) a cashier's or certified cheque
- 7.4. The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

## **8. INSPECTIONS, TESTS AND ANALYSES**

- 8.1. All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2. If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department or an organisation acting on behalf of the Department.

- 8.3. If there is no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing Energy Board concerned.
- 8.4. If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5. Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.
- 8.6. Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
- 8.7. Any contract supplies may, on or after delivery, be inspected, tested or analysed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.
- 8.8. The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

## **9. PACKING**

- 9.1. The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- 9.2. The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

## **10. DELIVERY OF DOCUMENTS**

- 10.1. Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC.
- 10.2. Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified in SCC.

## **11. INSURANCE**

- 11.1. The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.

## **12. TRANSPORTATION**

12.1. Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC.

## **13. INCIDENTAL SERVICES**

13.1. The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC:

- a) performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
- b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
- c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
- d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and
- e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.

13.2. Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

## **14. SPARE PARTS**

14.1. As specified in SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:

- a) Such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
- b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
  - i. Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
  - ii. Following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

## **15. WARRANTY**

15.1. The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.

15.2. This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.

15.3. The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.

- 15.4. Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- 15.5. Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- 15.6. If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

## **16. PAYMENT**

- 16.1. The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC.
- 16.2. The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of attendance register and upon fulfilment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- 16.3. Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.
- 16.4. Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.

## **17. PRICES**

- 17.1. Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorised in SCC or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.
- 17.2. GPAA will retain 10% of the amount approved pending the release of the Certificates of Competence or final results in case examination is written and results are to be released at a later stage. Once results are released and verified by GPAA, the retainer amount will be paid through to the training service provider.

## **18. CONTRACT AMENDMENTS**

- 18.1. No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.

## **19. ASSIGNMENT**

- 19.1. The supplier shall not assign or contract another supplier for full services or part-services, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

## **20. SUBCONTRACTS**

- 20.1. The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contract if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

## **21. DELAYS IN THE SUPPLIERS PERFORMANCE**

- 21.1. Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.
- 21.2. If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
- 21.3. No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or local authorities.
- 21.4. The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.
- 21.5. Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.
- 21.6. Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without cancelling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods/services not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods/ services delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

## **22. PENALTIES**

- 22.1. Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) and quality as specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods/services or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

## **23. TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT**

- 23.1. The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:
- a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;
  - b) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
  - c) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.
- 23.2. In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be

liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.

#### **24. ANTI-DUMPING AND COUNTERVAILING DUTIES AND RIGHTS**

24.1. When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or antidumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the contractor to the State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the contractor in regard to supplies or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him.

#### **25. FORCE MAJEURE**

25.1. Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.

25.2. If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

#### **26. TERMINATION FOR INSOLVENCY**

26.1. The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

#### **27. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES**

27.1. If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.

27.2. If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.

27.3. Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.

27.4. Mediation proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure specified in the SCC.

27.5. Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,

- a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and
- b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier.

27.6. Except in cases of criminal negligence or wilful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6.

## **28. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY**

28.1. The supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser.

28.2. The aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

## **29. GOVERNING LANGUAGE**

29.1. The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.

## **30. APPLICABLE LAW**

30.1. The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

## **31. NOTICES**

31.1. Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice.

31.2. The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

## **32. TAXES AND DUTIES**

32.1. A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.

32.2. A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.

32.3. No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid, GPAA must be in possession of a tax clearance certificate, submitted by the bidder. This certificate must be an original issued by the South African Revenue Services.
